EVENING PRAYER FOR PEACE IN THE HOLY LAND

On October 12th, Bishop Jensen shared with the priests of the diocese a letter from Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, and president of the Assembly of Catholic Ordinaries of the Holy Land. In Cardinal Pizzaballa's letter, he speaks of the reality of the "destruction", "death", "sorrow" and "political and military crisis" that is occurring in the Holy Land and he asks, on behalf of the bishops of the Holy Land, that all parishes and religious communities "hold a day of fasting, abstinence, and prayer" so that the world may "deliver to God the Father our thirst for peace, justice and reconciliation." In keeping with this request, parishioners of the Prince George city parishes are invited to gather at Sacred Heart Cathedral at 5:30 p.m., Friday, October 20th, for Evening Prayer (which will include Eucharistic Exposition and Adoration, and the recitation of the Holy Rosary). Parishioners who are able are also invited to dedicate that day to fasting and abstinence.

2023-24 Annual Called Together and Healing and Reconciliation Appeal Update

We are grateful to everyone for the tremendous support we have received since our last update. We have now reached 39% of the diocesan goal in pledges with almost 26% already received. In addition, our Healing and Reconciliation Appeal has raised almost \$8,00 with all the funds received.

A number of parishes made significant progress toward reaching their combined goal. Sacred Heart Cathedral and St. Mary's (PG) have both reached 44% with St. Joseph's in Vanderhoof slightly behind at 43%. Notre Dame has surpassed 30%, Sacred Heart Parish (Terrace) and Immaculate Conception (PG) have reached 29%, and St. Joseph's in Smithers has hit 24%. Many other parishes have been rapidly gaining ground as well.

We are very thankful for the participation and support from everyone. We know that with inflation making it harder for everyone, it's even more of a sacrifice to contribute this year. As our smaller parishes, missions and ministries are encountering the same challenges in meeting rising demands while confronting rising prices, we are ever more grateful for your sacrifice.

Feast of Our Lady of Aparecida

Three hundred years ago, October 12- Early on the morning of October 12, 1717, three Brazilian fishermen set out on the waters of the Paraiba River, which ran through their village. They were charged with providing the fish for the banquet that would be held a few days later in the village of Guarantinguetá on the visit of the Count of Assumar, Don Pedro de Almeida, Governor of the Province of São Paulo, and Minas Gerais, as he travelled to the town of Vila Rica. The three fishermen – Domingos Garcia, Filipe Pedroso, and João Alves – had had no luck that morning; they had been fishing for hours without catching anything. They had almost given up when João Alves decided to give it one more try. He cast his net into the river and slowly began to draw it in. There was something there, but it wasn't a fish... it seemed to be a piece of wood. When they pulled it out of the net, they saw that it was a statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary, with the head missing.

The miraculous catch- João cast his net into the waters once more, and pulling it in, he found another piece of wood which proved to be the statue's head. As if in response to strange instinct, he cast his net a third time into the river. When he tried to pull it in, he found it was full of fish. Now his companions cast their nets as well, and likewise found themselves overwhelmed with an abundance of fish.

Popular veneration- Over the course of the next few days, the three fishermen cleaned and re-assembled the statue, and Filipe Pedroso placed it in his humble abode. Soon after, news of the miraculous catch spread to the neighboring villages, and day-by-day more of their countrymen came to honor the Blessed Virgin and pray the Rosary. They gave her the name "Nossa Senhora da Conceição Aparecida," that is, Our Lady of the Appeared Conception.



As time went on, the crowds became so large that there was no longer room in the little hut. A small chapel was built, and later, in 1737, a larger one. Soon witnesses began to tell of many graces that were received from Our Lady, and of the many miracles that took place at the sanctuary.

The new church - In 1846 work began on a new church, which was completed in 1888. In 1904, the statue of Our Lady of Aparecida was crowned by order of Pope St Pius X. In 1930, Pope Pius XI declared Our Lady of Aparecida to be the Patroness of Brazil.



Pope Francis Visit to the Basilica- The Successor of Peter, Pope Francis visited the Basilica of Our Lady of Aparecida in 2013. During the World Youth Day in Rio, on July 24, 2013, Pope Francis went on a pilgrimage to the shrine of Aparecida. He said, "I had the joy and the grace," of praying at the feet of the Madonna, "entrusting my pontificate to her."

At St. Mary's Parish-since Mother Mary is the patron of our parish it is good to celebrate this month with love and prayers. October is the Month traditionally dedicated to the Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Through this celebration of the feast of our lady of Aparecida in our parish we are also coming closer to Mother Mary, the Immaculate Conception, through our prayers and Sacraments, seeking her powerful protection and intercession.
