ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI AND THE LEPER

Today's Scripture lesson teaches us that the sick and the maimed are not to be objects of scorn, but potential reservoirs of God's mercy for us. St. Francis of Assisi, for instance, understood this. At one time in his life, he had a terrible fear of lepers. Then one day when he was out for a ride, he heard the warning bell that lepers were required to ring in the Middle Ages. When a leper emerged from a clump of trees, St. Francis saw that we was horribly disfigured. Half of his nose had been eaten away; his hands were stubs without fingers and his lips were oozing white pus. Instead of giving in to his fears, Francis slid down from his horse, ran forward, embraced the leper and kissed him. Francis' life was never the same after that episode. He had found a new relationship with others and a new energy for his ministry.

Readings and Liturgy

Leviticus 13.1-2, 45-46; Psalm 32.1-2, 5, 11;

1 Corinthians 10.31–11.1; Gospel: Mark 1.40-45. The first reading regulates procedures for dealing with people with skin disease. They are denounced unclean and must live alone. Paul calls the Corinthians to give glory to God in everything they do. In the Gospel, Jesus is moved with pity for a man with leprosy. Jesus touches the man, and he is made clean. *Faith Catholic*

"Gentlemen! Gentlemen! I am nothing!"

One evening, after a brilliant performance of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony, conductor Arturo Toscanini found himself facing a crowd gone wild. They applauded, whistled, stamped their feet and nearly deafened him with shouts of "Bravo! Bravo!" Toscanini bowed repeatedly and then turned to acknowledge the artistry of the orchestra. With a breathlessness in his hushed voice, he leaned in close and said, "Gentlemen! Gentlemen! I am nothing!" This was an extraordinary admission, given his enormous ego. Then the great conductor added, "Gentlemen, you are nothing." they had heard that same message countless times during rehearsal. "But Beethoven", said Toscanini with a tone of adoration in his voice, "Beethoven is everything, everything, everything!" - Centuries before Beethoven and Toscanini, Paul had come to the same realization as regards Jesus. Christ was "everything, everything, everything" for the great apostle to the Gentiles and he, for his part wished to share his experience of and relationship with Christ with everyone he met. In today's second reading, Paul was trying to convince this Corinthian converts of the supreme importance of Christ in their lives. For Paul, Christ was everything, everything, everything. ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are universal days of Fasting and Abstinence in the Church. Fasting is binding on all those who are 18 to 59 years of age and in reasonable health, and abstinence from meat is binding on those 14 and older. Parents and educators are the greatest influence in modelling these practices of penance to children too young to participate, and they have a duty to introduce children to these practices and help them understand their importance. Fasting is one of the three pillars of Lent, along with prayer and almsgiving. It is a practice of self-discipline with a focus on penance intended to purify our faith and serve as a witness to the depth of our faith. It allows us to share in the suffering of those who are starving.

Abstinence from meat is done in remembrance of the Lord's Passion, how he gave up his flesh for us, and as another act of communal penance.

Traditionally, money saved from fasting and abstinence has also been given to the poor.


Pallottine Mission Appeal 2024

"Every Catholic, whether priest, religious or lay faithful, should rejoice because all of their talents, knowledge, studies, power, nobility, profession, art, earthly goods, service, prayers used for the propagation of faith and rekindling of charity in the world can acquire the merit of the apostolate."- St. Vincent Pallotti

We, the Society of the Catholic Apostolate, are a community embedded in a large international network called the Union of the Catholic Apostolate (UAC – from the Latin "Unio Apostolatus Catholici". Our members are called Pallottines, taken from the name of our founder, Vincent Pallotti. Our roles are as diverse as the talents of our confreres. Everyone brings his abilities to bear, which are complemented and completed in the others. We gladly work together with all people. All Christian concerns are significant to us. We try to respond to the concerns and needs of our contemporaries through the inspiration of the Christian faith.

The mission of the Society of the Catholic Apostolate (SAC) is in line with the mission of Jesus Christ and of the Church - "to revive faith and re-enkindle charity of the entire People of God and to spread the faith and charity in the world, so that soon there may be but one flock and one shepherd" (John 10,16).





When Pallotti died on January 22, 1850, the Society was in its infancy stage. By the year 1869 there were only ten priests and four Brothers. Today, by the grace of God, the society has nearly 39 entities with the total membership around 2400. It first began in Italy 1835 by Pallotti along with some diocesan priests who willingly came forward to work with our founder.

The Pallottines are pioneers in the field of the lay apostolate and in reawakening among the people of God a sense of their Christian vocation.

The Pallottines by virtue of their charism engage themselves in all apostolic works, but in a special way in those areas where most others would be reluctant to tread. The Pallottine Province in Tamil Nadu, India, is called "Our Lady of Good Health" (OLGH) and this name has a history of Catholicism behind it, as it has its roots in the apparitions of Mother Mary in Velankanni in the 16th century. Our Province is blessed with 96 Priests, and 49 students in various levels of formation. In Tamil Nadu, we are involved mainly in the pastoral care of the people in the parishes, in education ministry for the poor children, in social empowerment of women, and in healing ministry. We are also working in Indian and foreign missions.

Father Aruldhas Lucas, the Pastor of St. Mary's Parish, belongs to the OLGH Province. The Diocese of Prince George supports the society by allowing a mission collection once a year in the parishes where the Pallottines are working. And it is with this financial support that we run the institutions, seminaries, mission parishes, and apostolic works.



Dear brothers and sisters, I request you to support financially the mission of the church which our Founder, St. Vincent Pallotti, has shown and lived.
